Has your district received your program supplies?

To receive program supplies (inhalers and spacers), each school must complete the following steps:

- Two staff at each school must complete the web-based curriculum "Stock Albuterol Inhaler Training for School Personnel".
- 2. Upload the web-based curriculum certificates to the School Surveillance Medication Program (SSMP).
- 3. Request a signed standing medical order though the SSMP.

Supplies will be provided to the district lead once all schools have completed the steps above.

The Stock Inhaler for Schools Program is free during the 2023-2024 school year due to funding from the Maricopa County Department of Public Health and a generous donation from Mercy C.A.R.E.S. It is vital to ensure future funding so the program can continue at no cost.

Stock Albuterol Inhaler Training for School Personnel

To participate in the Stock Inhaler for Schools Program, a minimum of two on-site staff at each school must complete the web-based Stock Albuterol Inhaler Training for School Personnel though the Western Regional Public Health Training Center.

The training is self-paced and takes no more than 30-45 minutes to complete. Make sure to save your certificate so you or your nurse lead can upload the certificate to the SSMP. Remember, the training must be completed annually.
